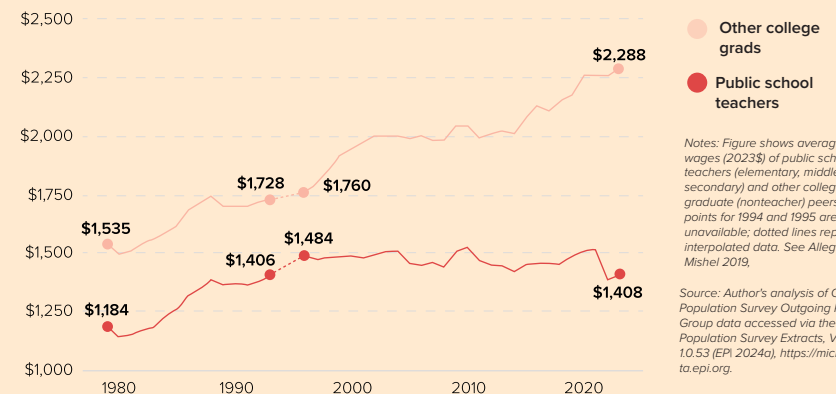
SAFE & STABLE SCHOOLS FOR OUR STUDENTS & COMMUNITIES
